### Permit

The Town of Bedford Tiny Tots Program:

1. Must have a permit from the Westchester Department of Health in order to operate.

2. Is required to be inspected yearly.
3. Required camp safety plans, medical and fire safety plans and inspection reports are on file at the Westchester County Department, Bureau of Public Health Protection, North Bedford Rd. Mt. Kisco, NY, and are available for your review.

## **Staff**

Westchester County Department of Health requires camps to maintain a counselor/ camper ratio of 1:12. Most of our camp directors are certified teachers and well qualified. All Staff must attend pre-camp orientation training. Our specialists and directors are all trained in Responding to Emergencies and CPR for the Professional Rescuer.

## **Group Assignments:**

Generally our grouping is as follows:

1 Girls/Boys	3 ½ yrs old
2 Girls/Boys	4 yrs old
3 Girls/Boys	4 ½ yrs old
4 Girls/Boys	5 yrs old

**\*\*\* There are times that we may split groups due to size\*\*\***

Each group will have an average of 12 campers. Each group will be staffed with one senior counselor and 1-2 Junior Counselors and or CIT's. The camper to counselor ratio meets or exceeds standards set up by the Department of Health.

## **Daily Routines:**

### **Morning-9:00-11:45**

We start the day with a 15 minute camper arrival and announcement period. The rest of the morning will consist of four 30-minute activity periods. During that time groups will be lead through various activities, which include arts and crafts, outdoor play, games, music and movement, story telling and many other counselor run activities. The children do have a 15-minute snack time in-between the activity periods. . The end of the days ends with a 15-minute dismissal period, which often includes announcements and distribution of flyers, and parent pick up.

**\*\*Parents are asked to please be prompt in picking up their campers.**

**9:00 - 9:15-** Arrival and Announcements

**9:15 - 10:15-** Two 30-minute activity periods. During that time groups will be lead through various activities, which include arts and crafts, outdoor play, games, music and movement, story telling and many other counselor run activities.

**10:15 - 10:30** - Snack time - We provide a light snack- parents are welcome to send in their own snacks for their campers.

**10:30 - 11:30** - Two 30-minute activity periods

**11:35- 11:50** - The end of the days ends with a 15-minute dismissal period, which often includes announcements and distribution of flyers, and parent pick up.

**\*\*Parents are asked to please be prompt in picking up their campers.**

### **Snack**

Some children in the camp program are **HIGHLY** allergic to nuts. We offer snack without peanuts or made in peanut areas) some examples of our food choices are goldfish, pretzels, crackers, and cheerios. On occasion we may provide a special snack. If you would like to provide your child with their own snack please feel free to do so.

### **Special Programs**

During the camp session in addition to the daily activities there will be numerous special events. These would include special theme days, shows by professional entertainers, etc. The recreation and parks staff plan some of the activities, while our camp staff plans others.



### **Notes from Home**

For the safety of your camper, written parental permission (note) must be sent for the following:

- If your camper is to leave camp with a friend, neighbor, relative, or someone other than his or her usual ride. If your child's counselor does not receive a note, your child will not be released.
- For car pools or arrangements that will last for the whole summer, one note specifying days and person picking up/ dropping off your camper will be kept on file for the summer. Please note that we will need written permission for everyone in the car pool.
- We will use emergency contacts as approved persons to pick up you child at any time.

**\*\*\*Notes should specify your camper's name, group, and counselor as well as the other pertinent information.**

## First Aid

In the event that your child becomes ill or injured during the camp day they will be escorted to the camp office and cared for by one of our trained staff or our camp EMT. If the situation warrants, the camp staff will contact you. Depending on the severity of the injury the child will either stay at camp, be picked up, or if needed the Bedford Police and ambulance will be called to assist with medical issues.

**\*\*\*WE CARE!** Should your child have to visit our health office for any reason during the camp day, a pink slip, or "boo boo report" will accompany your child home with all of the details. You will be notified of every scrape, bump and belly ache. If you know of a "boo-boo" that was not attended to, please inform the camp director, in order to help us keep staff reminded that nothing is to be ignored.



## Medical Forms

If your child is required to take any type of medication during camp hours, a Medical Permission Form **MUST** be filled out by the parent and physician, and handed in with the medication the first day your child attends camp. Medication will be kept in the camp office or in your child's bag, and our staff will oversee and supervise the child in self-administering their own medication. By law, camp personnel cannot dispense internal medication to the child unless they are a NYS licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or registered nurse.

Written permission can be given by both the physician and parent to allow the camper to carry medication that is needed for emergency purposes (i.e.: epi pen; asthma inhaler).

All medication must be in their original container and labeled correctly.

## Allergies

The Town of Bedford cannot guarantee an absolute allergen-free environment. However, it is the goal of this policy to create a peanut/nut awareness camp. We ask for your cooperation in working towards this goal.

It is important that children with risk of anaphylaxis or an anaphylactic reaction to any substance (food, insect bites, drugs ect.) be identified. We encourage families of campers with life threatening or serious food allergy to meet with directors during the start of camp.

We have the following guidelines in effect:

- We will not do any craft projects that include peanuts
- If your child eats peanut products for breakfast we would greatly appreciate your making them wash their hand with soap and water before leaving for camp.

- We do not encourage homemade birthday treats or special snacks. If you wish to celebrate at camp please discuss with the director before the event.

Throughout the course of the summer if you have any questions or concern about food allergy related issues, please do not hesitate to ask the staff.

### Clothing

All Campers should wear SNEAKERS each day so they can full participate in camp activities. Sandals, teva's and dress shoes Are NOT appropriate for camp activities. Please be advised that when necessary, campers' may be prohibited from participating in certain activities for safety reasons. Come to camp as comfortable as possible. Shorts, shirt, and sneakers should be worn. Please label your campers clothing.

### Refunds

The Town of Bedford will refund your camp fee less \$25 if requested in writing prior to the beginning of camp. No refunds will be given once camp begins except for documented medical reasons.

**\*\* Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>** we will be hosting a Meet-Your-Counselor 'Cookie Social' at your child's camp site from 1:45-2:30pm, for those of you who would like to know which face to look for and get a chance to say hello. We recommend the event for younger campers, who might have apprehensions or normal first-day concerns and curiosities. We're here. Stop by!
